ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

FIRST-YEAR STUDENTS

You are eligible for automatic admission if you are on-track to complete your high school course pattern requirements, and meet one or more of the following criteria:

- Your cumulative high school GPA is at least 2.75 / 4.0
- You are ranked in the top 10% of your graduating class
 - You have a 23 ACT or a 1130 SAT

Not quite there? We'll consider your admission application through a holistic review process if your cumulative high school GPA is at least 2.0/4.0 — we'll consider every factor we can in your favor. Students admitted through this process are welcomed with a program providing support through academic coaching, advising, mentoring, and tutoring.

TRANSFER STUDENTS

- You have 12 transferable semester hours / 18 quarter hours (Students with fewer than 12 transferable hours must also meet first-year admission requirements)
 - Your transferring GPA is at least 2.0 / 4.0
- Transfer students are eligible for automatic admissions if they obtain the following degrees:

 AA or AS from an Illinois community college

 CORE 42/AA from a Missouri community college

AA or AS degree from the Kentucky Community and Technical Community College System
AA or AS from Nashville State Community College (TN)



SIU'S AIM HIGH/SALUKI COMMITMENT

If you're an Illinois student and your federal and state aid don't cover full tuition and mandatory fees, SIU will—up to 8 consecutive semesters for first-year students or 4 for transfers.

You may qualify if you:

- Have a 2.75+ high school GPA or 2.0+ college GPA
 - Are under age 24 and a dependent
- Have family income under \$103,040 and assets under \$50,000
